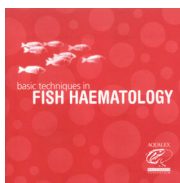

Basic Techniques in Fish Haematology CD-ROM

An interactive guide to the practical skills in collecting and analysing fish blood samples, in three sections: i) fish blood constituents ii) the collection of blood samples iii) haematological techniques.

Interactive Training Materials

The experience gained from the AQUALEX multimedia project enabled the AquaTT/AMC team, in cooperation with the Institute of Marine Biology, Crete, to use its experience of the latest online/multimedia technology to create online courses with the potential of worldwide dissemination through the worldwide web.

Course materials in five important areas were designed and programmed as online easily accessible modules which were used, not only by students in the partner countries and colleges, but by clients from all over the world, thus showing the genuine usefulness of such courses as part of a virtual learning environment. Greek and Norwegian versions were also produced and made freely available.

AQUAFLOW II is a European Network for the Dissemination of Aquaculture RTD Results, a highly successful European project coordinated by the European Aquaculture Society. Leaflets on technical issues are disseminated in print and online format to over 150,000 end-users working in the European Aquaculture Industry. A major part of its dissemination thrust comes from its translation of the leaflets into the major EU languages, as AquaFlow currently operates in 19 countries where 16 languages are spoken.
